FBA Activates ABA Foundation's Disaster Relief Program for <u>Hurricane Ian Recovery</u>

ABA pledges \$100,000 to Volunteer Florida's Hurricane Ian relief efforts; collects funds from the banking industry nationwide

TALLAHASSEE—Following the devastation of Hurricane Ian, which made landfall on the southwest coast of Florida as a powerful Category 4 storm, the American Bankers Association (ABA) Foundation is soliciting donations from across the country to help with relief efforts. Millions of Floridians, including local bank employees, have been directly impacted by the hurricane, and banks serving southwest Florida have suffered direct damage to their facilities.
